Collect for the Seventh Sunday after Pentecost

O Lord, mercifully receive the prayers of your people who call upon you, and grant that they may know and understand what things they should do, and grace and power faithfully to accomplish them; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Our collect for today has a very long history. It was initially written for the Gregorian Sacramentary of the tenth century to be used for The First Sunday After Christmas. Later, this collect was moved to the First Sunday After Epiphany. The Sarum missal of the eleventh century adopted this prayer for the Sunday after the Octave of Epiphany. As you can see, it was moved farther and farther away from the original connection to Christmas. In 1549, because Thomas Cranmer dropped the observance of that Epiphany Octave, he returned the collect to its use at the feast of the First Sunday after the Epiphany where it remained through our 1928 Book of Common Prayer. The 1979 prayer book revision placed this collect where we find it today, Proper 10 after Pentecost, the Sunday closest to July 13.

This final move to what we call “normal time” may seem to be a debasement for a collect that had connections to red letter feast days. However, I find the move to be not only proper, but also utilitarian. This prayer is a strictly “no nonsense prayer” and, it should be sincerely prayed every day. The petition is twofold. We are asking God to tell us what ought to do and then to have the wherewithal to do it. This should be the sum and substance of all our prayers. I think we, too often, decide how we want things to be and then ask God to make that plan happen. We come to God with readymade solutions for our problems. Those solutions may very well be perfect for ourselves but may not be within God’s plan for us. If we truly commit our lives to God, we need to discern what God wants of us. What are we to be? How are we to be? And then we must listen.

Father Chase on Continuing Education study time July 11-17

Organ Update

We are pleased to report that repair of the organ is now underway. We have engaged Larry Trupiano, who is a leading expert in precisely the type of instrument we have (FYI: he also cares for the organ at the Great Auditorium in Ocean Grove). The damaged reservoirs are now in Larry's workshop in Brooklyn and will be completely rebuilt using the same materials and methods that were originally used to build our historic instrument. Larry is known for his meticulous work and, after the reservoirs have been restored, returned, and reinstalled, we expect them to last for as many decades as the originals did. We hope the instrument will be up and playing in about two weeks.
