A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:26-28)

Happy Easter! The season of Easter, also called Eastertide, is 50 days, so we have an abundance of time to celebrate the Resurrection. I want to take a moment to say thank you to everyone who made Holy Week and Easter Day so wonderful. From Palm Sunday to the Day of Resurrection, each service was meaningful and inspiring. I have heard from several of you how special this Holy Week was for you. I feel similarly. Holy Week is always a special time, but things came together in a powerful way. One of the highlights of the week was Tuesday's Agape meal, which was so beautifully presented by the Hospitality Committee and the Rev. Geoff Curtiss, with the assistance of the Wednesday Bible Sharing Group and others. The Choir, under the leadership of Dr. Deborah Simpkin King, went above and beyond throughout the week. They were majestic for the triumphal services, and powerfully introspective for the more solemn services (this year we turned the instruments off and went a capella for Good Friday's evening service and the liturgy of word portion of the Easter Vigil, until the Easter Acclamation). Thanks also to Michael Parent, who accompanied the choir on organ for some of the services, including Easter Day at 10 am, while Dr. King conducted. Many thanks to all of our worship leaders, greeters, ushers, lectors, audio and livestream technicians, Altar Guild, Coffee Hour hosts, and office volunteers and staff for everything they did to make the services run smoothly and beautifully. And a big big thank you to our Verger team -- Dave Osis, Russ Boulet, Lesley Castellini, John Scherer, and Adrienne Wert -- for their incredible generosity of time and talent. The Vergers take a significant leadership role in preparing and running worship services, and I am so grateful to them.

In this Sunday's gospel reading, the disciples are coming to terms with this strange and wonderful event that has taken place. Thomas needs to see it for himself, and so Jesus appears and shows him his wounds. It is a moving scene, and it makes me think about all the places of woundedness in our lives that become sites of new life. In the early hours of Easter Monday, our brother in the faith, Pope Francis, passed away. In his compassion for the poor and the powerless, he was an inspiration to all of us, not only to the Roman Catholic Church that he led. His legacy is also marked by a willingness to have difficult conversations, even if the outcomes were not always what supporters or opponents hoped. I pray that as the world mourns him, the Catholic College of Cardinals will be moved by the Holy Spirit to elect a worthy successor. May this moment of sadness be transformed into a time of joyful new life.
