Christ our Passover w nostrum

1 Corinthians 5:7-8; Romans 6:9-11; 1 Corinthians 15:20-22 Alleluia. Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us; * therefore let us keep the feast, Not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, * but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Alleluia. Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; * death no longer has dominion over him. The death that he died, he died to sin, once for all; * but the life he lives, he lives to God. So also consider yourselves dead to sin, * and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia. Christ has been raised from the dead, * the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since by a man came death, * by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, * so also in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia.

⁷ I lie awake and groan; * I am like a sparrow, lonely on a house-top. ⁸ My enemies revile me all day long, * and those who scoff at me have taken an oath against me. ⁹ For I have eaten ashes for bread * and mingled my drink with weeping. ¹⁰ Because of your indignation and wrath * you have lifted me up and thrown me away. ¹¹ My days pass away like a shadow, * and I wither like the grass. ¹² But you, O Lord, endure for ever, * and your Name from age to age. ¹³ You will arise and have compassion on Zion, for it is time to have mercy upon her; * indeed, the appointed time has come. ¹⁴ For your servants love her very rubble, * and are moved to pity even for her dust. ¹⁵ The nations shall fear your Name, O Lord, * and all the kings of the earth your glory. ¹⁶ For the Lord will build up Zion, * and his glory will appear. ¹⁷ He will look with favor on the prayer of the homeless; * he will not despise their plea. ¹⁸ Let this be written for a future generation, * so that a people yet unborn may praise the Lord. ¹⁹ For the Lord looked down from his holy place on high; * from the heavens he beheld the Earth; ²⁰ That he might hear the groan of the captive * and set free those condemned to die; ²¹ That they may declare in Zion the Name of the Lord, * and his praise in Jerusalem; ²² When the peoples are gathered together, * and the kingdoms also, to serve the Lord. ²³ He has brought down my strength before my time; * he has shortened the number of my days; ²⁴ And I said, "O my God, do not take me away in the midst of my days; * your years endure throughout all generations. ²⁵ In the beginning, O Lord, you laid the foundations of the Earth. * and the heavens are the work of your hands; ²⁶ They shall perish, but you will endure: they all shall wear out like a garment; * as clothing you will change them, and they shall be changed; ²⁷ But you are always the same, * and your years will never end.

The Old Testament Lesson

Reader

A reading from the Prophet Ezekiel 34:17-31

¹⁷As for you, my flock, thus says the Lord God: I shall judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and goats: ¹⁸Is it not enough for you to feed on the good pasture, but you must tread down with your feet the rest of your pasture? When you drink of clear water, must you foul the rest with your feet? ¹⁹And must my sheep eat what you have trodden with your feet, and drink what you have fouled with your feet? ²⁰Therefore, thus says the Lord God to them: I myself will judge between the fat sheep and the lean sheep. ²¹Because you pushed with flank and shoulder, and butted at all the weak animals with your horns until you scattered them far and wide, ²²I will save my flock, and they shall no longer be ravaged; and I will judge between sheep and sheep. ²³I will set up over them one shepherd, my servant David, and he shall feed them: he shall feed them and be their shepherd. ²⁴And I, the Lord, will be their God, and my servant David shall be prince among them; I, the Lord, have spoken. ²⁵I will make with them a covenant of peace and banish wild animals from the land, so that they may live in the wild and sleep in the woods securely. ²⁶I will make them and the region around my hill a blessing; and I will send down the showers in their season; they shall be showers of blessing. ²⁷The trees of the field shall yield their fruit, and the earth shall yield its increase. They shall be secure on their soil; and they shall know that I am the Lord, when I break the bars of their voke, and save them from the hands of those who enslaved them. ²⁸They shall no more be plunder for the nations, nor shall the animals of the land devour them; they shall live in safety, and no one shall make them afraid. ²⁹I will provide for them a splendid vegetation so that they shall no more be consumed with hunger in the land, and no longer suffer the insults of the nations. ³⁰They shall know that I, the Lord their God, am with them, and that they, the house of Israel, are my people, says the Lord God. ³¹You are my sheep, the sheep of my pasture and I am your God, says the Lord God.

The New Testament Lesson

Reader

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews 8:1-13

¹Now the main point in what we are saying is this: we have such a high priest, one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens, ²a minister in the sanctuary and the true tent that the Lord, and not any mortal, has set up. ³For every high priest is appointed to offer gifts and sacrifices; hence it is necessary for this priest also to have something to offer. ⁴Now if he were on earth, he would not be a priest at all, since there are priests who offer gifts according to the law. ⁵They offer worship in a sanctuary that is a sketch and shadow of the heavenly one; for Moses, when he was about to erect the tent, was warned, "See that you make everything according to the pattern that was shown you on the mountain." ⁶But Jesus has now obtained a more excellent ministry, and to that degree he is the mediator of a better covenant, which has been enacted through better promises. ⁷For if that first covenant had been faultless, there would have been no need to look for a second one. 8God finds fault with them when he says: "The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will establish a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah; ⁹not like the covenant that I made with their ancestors, on the day when I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt; for they did not continue in my covenant, and so I had no concern for them, says the Lord. ¹⁰This is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their minds, and write them on their hearts, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ¹¹And they shall not teach one another or say to each other, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest. ¹²For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more," ¹³In speaking of "a new covenant," he has made the first one obsolete. And what is obsolete and growing old will soon disappear.

The Commemoration

Ini Kopuria (died 1945), a police officer from Maravovo, Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands formed the Melanesian Brotherhood in 1925. He and the Bishop of Melanesia, the Right Reverend John Manwaring Steward, realized Ini's dream by forming a band of brothers (known in the Mota language as 'Ira Reta Tasiu') to take the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the non-Christian areas of Melanesia. He is commemorated in the calendars of the Church of the Province of Melanesia and of the Church of England.
