Last week we celebrated Trinity Sunday and 150 years of Trinity Church. The bishop was present to preach and celebrate the Eucharist, and at the 10 am service, she confirmed and received 13 youth and 5 adults. The music was incredible, and the liturgy was uplifting. Following the later service, we held a festive reception with presentations by elected officials. It was a truly joyous occasion. I think the whole day could be summed up in the bishop's reaction to the first ten minutes of the service, which featured a completely full church, a beautiful gospel anthem, a stirring brass-accompanied opening hymn, and the dramatic pageantry of the opening procession: "Wow!" Several others have reported that they were "beaming" and "floating on air" for the rest of the day and even into the week. I share those sentiments.

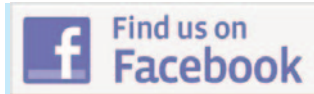

### **"Good Neighbor" Facilitator Volunteers Needed for Saturday Soup and Pantry**

As The Trinity Center for Community has grown, our programs are serving more people. This is great news, but it also means that we need to be careful stewards of how this good work impacts our facilities, grounds, and neighborhood. One area that we need extra help with is in facilitating a more welcoming environment for all our guests and surrounding neighborhood. This includes reducing parking violations, outside conversational noise, and smoking during Saturday Soup and Food Pantry hours. The tasks of the volunteer would be to kindly ask community members not to congregate in front of the gym or in the parking lot after using the Pantry or dining at Saturday Soup, to remind guests and volunteers of our smoke-free campus wide policy, and to monitor the parking lot and street to prevent double parking and driveways being blocked. This volunteer would also have a walkie talkie to use to connect with Trinity staff inside of the building at all times. This volunteer position would require someone to have or receive training in conflict de-escalation skills, in case anyone reacts negatively to requests.
