

The Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

July 13, 2025

Save the weak and the orphan; defend the humble and needy; Rescue the weak and the poor; deliver them from the power of the wicked. They do not know, neither do they understand; they go about in darkness; all the foundations of the earth are shaken. (Psalm 82:3-5)

We have all been shocked and saddened by the tragedy that unfolded in the Texas hill country early in the morning of July 4. What should have been a day of celebration turned into a day of terror and mourning. As I write this, at least 120 people--including many children--have died. Even more are still missing. There are many unanswered questions about why there were not more safeguards in place. Residents had complained for years about needing a better warning system. A camp continued to build cabins in flood-prone areas deemed hazardous by county officials, even as inspectors signed off on the projects. We could criticize the camp, religiously affiliated but for-profit, as prioritizing money above safety, but one of the coowners, who perished in the flood, was known to be very cautious about flood risk planning; he never imagined that the protections in place would fail. Some have asserted that federal budget cuts to the National Weather Service and FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) contributed to the tragedy, but it is not known at this time whether key personnel were missing and, if so, whether it is because they are no longer employed or stretched too thin. So many factors contributed to the slow response. One local cell phone warning system failed to be activated until hours after the Guadalupe River began rapidly flooding. At one camp, campers and counselors were not permitted to have cell phones--a digital detox so that everyone could enjoy the beauty of nature--but the camp's PA system was knocked out by flooding. A thorough investigation is certainly needed, one that examines federal, state, county, municipal, and camp policies and procedures.

While journalistic and government investigations continue, I caution us against placing blame too quickly. I have heard of very negative and mean-spirited things said online, including even statements to the effect of "Texas is getting what it deserves." I was born and raised in Texas. There is much I love about my home state, and there are also many reasons why I do not live there anymore. But no one deserves a tragedy like this, especially not the children who died and those who survived but are traumatized. Let us instead seek the path of compassion, even as we rightfully ask questions about whether lives could have been saved by better planning, warning, and emergency response systems.

### Rector Responds to IRS Ruling on Political Endorsements by Faith Communities

*From the Rev. Chase Danford, Rector:* This week the Internal Revenue Service reversed long-standing policy preventing houses of worship from endorsing political candidates. To be clear, faith communities have always had the right to endorse candidates, but they risked losing their tax-exempt status if they did so. I believe this decision is a mistake, one that is unhealthy for our democracy and for faith communities. Please know that Trinity will not be endorsing political candidates. We discuss public issues, and we advocate for policies that flow from our values. But it is one thing to advocate for specific measures to improve lives and another to endorse candidates. No candidate is perfect. Some candidates are clearly flawed. But people have good reasons for voting for flawed candidates. It is up to us as a faith community to be clear about our values, and then hope that our members are guided by those values when they vote.
