

The Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

September 7, 2025

Lord, you have searched me out and known me; you know my sitting down and my rising up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You trace my journeys and my resting-places and are acquainted with all my ways...I will thank you because I am marvelously made; your works are wonderful, and I know it well. (Psalm 139:1-2, 13)

This Sunday we launch a new church program year. Sunday school begins, the choir returns for a new season, adult education classes resume, the Hospitality Committee will host a festive coffee hour, and people will be re-gathering after summer travels and activities. It promises to be a joyous day. Although this is the official start to the program year, last Sunday felt in many ways like a "soft launch:" the blessing of the backpacks for students and educators returning to school, a sermon for all ages geared toward our young parishioners, an ice cream social, and a number of visitors. One of the visitors expressed how wonderful our church is, and I agree! Many thanks to all those who donated backpacks and school supplies. They were also blessed last Sunday, and they will be put to very good use by local students. A big thank you also to all the singers and musicians who contributed to our summer choir offerings.

Last weekend also brought a somber event, with Saturday's funeral for Devin Brown. Trinity really showed up to remember Devin, and I thank you all for your presence. The choir, which Devin loved so dearly, was there in full force, and we had a plentiful group of worship volunteers--so that we could put together a full procession and have all the readings and ushering needs covered. And I want to give a special shout-out to our Hospitality Committee, which hosted a wonderful reception following the service. I know the whole day, from the service to the repast, meant so much to Devin's family. They could definitely see how much Trinity loved Devin, and how much she loved this church.

Another sign of how much Trinity means to all of you is the outpouring of support for the Jersey Shore Ride for Food Justice. As I write this, we have exceeded \$60,000 in fundraising, registered around 200 riders, and recruited dozens of volunteers to help make it the great success it always is. Let's all give a big thank you to Dave Osis, who leads this huge undertaking, and to the entire Ride Committee. I also want to recognize Wendy Jaghhab, who leads the picnic committee in preparing a meal for 300.

To paraphrase Sunday's psalm, I give thanks because Trinity is marvelously made; God's works through you are wonderful, and I know it well.

# Guest Preacher on October 12: Human Rights Advocate Noah Bullock

Human rights are under siege with the rise of authoritarian governments around the world. Our own administration has walked away from basic international agreements on the protection of human rights and recognition of human equality and dignity. Noah Bulloch, executive director of Cristosal and a leading human rights figure in Latin America, will be with us at Trinity on Sunday October 12th. Ruth Lopez, a leading human rights attorney and a member of Cristosal's staff, remains imprisoned under President Bukele's authoritarian "State of Exception." As a result Cristosal has been forced into exile and is currently working out of Guatemala. Please keep Ruth and all human rights workers in your prayers.
