

The Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost

October 26, 2025

Then afterward I will pour out my spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions. (Joel 2:28)

This is a favorite passage of mine. This Old Testament prophetic vision of God's spirit descending on all the people is later quoted by the apostle Peter in the Acts of the Apostles on the Day of Pentecost. In the context of the Book of Joel, the prophecy is a proclamation of restoration: the people would suffer calamity, but God's favor would be restored, and God's spirit would be with them. In Acts, Peter connects Joel's prophecy with the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the early Church. God's spirit manifested that day in the ability to speak and understand diverse languages, as well as tongues of fire and the rush of a violent wind.

My key takeaway is that this is a gift (and responsibility) for all people, not just some. Not just the people of Israel or the early followers of Jesus. And, in fact, the Hebrew word, basar, is rendered accurately in our NRSV version as "flesh." "I will pour out my spirit on all flesh." Not just people, but all creatures. How will we listen and watch for God's spirit in all of creation?

Our fellow humans and fellow creatures have wisdom to share with us. Let us listen closely to visions, dreams and prophecies in unexpected forms. In my experience, most of those who claim to have a religious prophecy to share are not to be trusted. But the Spirit speaks in many languages, both actual and metaphorical. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s dream was no doubt a revelation of the Spirit. People in our own community might be articulating hopes and dreams, too, stated in a more local framework. Prophecies are not so much predictions of the future as an assessment of the needs and concerns of the world in which we live--and a vision for how to address the situation. To hear these dreams, we need to make sure to pay attention. That starts with listening and getting to know our human and animal neighbors.

## Cristosal Update: The Urgency of Now

Across Central America, civic space is shrinking. In El Salvador, tens of thousands have been arbitrarily detained. In Guatemala, Indigenous leaders and communities are mobilizing against entrenched corruption. In Honduras, defenders face threats as the country approaches tense elections. Despite these challenges, Cristosal remains strong, independent, and regionally rooted. We are rebuilding, expanding victim support across borders, and investing in new leadership—youth, women, LGBTQIA+ advocates, and grassroots organizers. In November we celebrate 25 years of accompanying victims of human rights abuses.
