"Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." (Matthew 4:19)

In Sunday's gospel, we hear the evangelist Matthew's account of the calling of the first disciples: two pairs of brothers, Simon Peter and Andrew, and James and John. They were fishermen, and as they were casting their nets into the sea, he spoke to them and invited them into a new journey: to follow him, and they would "fish for people."

Jesus had other work for them to do, and so he invited them to follow him, using language familiar to them: fish, yes, but for people. Jesus calls us all to be fishers of people: to find those who are lost, to heal those who experience brokenness, to release those imprisoned by injustice, to be peacemakers. This is the work of ministry, and all of us are called to ministry.

The symbolism of being fishers of people is meaningful, but we do need to be careful not to fall into a way of thinking that makes "us" as members of the church always the fisherpeople and "them" as people in the world the fish that need to be caught and brought into the church. We are all both fishers and fish. We are all in need of being found, of being healed, of being free to live without injustice, to live in peace. And so, sometimes we are the fish, and sometimes we are the fishers. Together, we fish for one another.

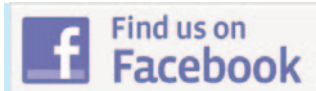

Faye Hudson was a long-time member of Trinity Church and long-time resident of Asbury Park. She was active at both the church and in the community before illness kept her at home. Several years ago the Coaster interviewed her and asked what she likes to do on snow days. She responded, "Crafts, physical therapy, healthcare bingo" and that she stays busy. Fr. Chase writes, "During my first summer here at Trinity, when we were still in the midst of COVID-19 and worshipping together was difficult, I remember Faye rolling up to the church in her motorized wheelchair to celebrate her 90th birthday with a blessing." In more recent years, Faye stayed connected to the church through home communion visits by clergy and Lay Eucharistic Visitors, notes written by the Trinity Cares team, and Christmas caroling with a group of Trinity folks who visit nearby care facilities during holiday seasons.
