*Come, let us sing to the Lord; let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.
Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.
For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.
In his hand are the caverns of the earth, and the heights of the hills are his also.
The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands have molded the dry land.
Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee, and kneel before the Lord our Maker.
For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand.
Oh, that today you would hearken to his voice! (Psalm 95:1-7)*

Sunday's psalm has long been used as a call to worship in Christian communities, dating at least to the sixth century of the Common Era, when St Benedict prescribed its use in the morning worship of his monastic community. When the first English prayer book was assembled by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer, Psalm 95 was included as an invitatory psalm to be used on a mostly daily basis (called invitatory because it is read before other psalms, inviting worshippers to pray the psalms). Those of you who have a daily practice of praying Morning Prayer, or who grew up in the Episcopal Church when Morning Prayer was the principal Sunday service (common until the 1970's), might know Psalm 95 as "the Venite." Each of the psalms has a Latin name, derive from the first words of the psalm. In the case of Psalm 95, "venite" is the Latin for "come," as the psalmist invites us to join in worshipping God.

The Book of Common Prayer offers many resources for creating a regular rhythm of spiritual practice into our lives. The "gold standard" is the Daily Office of Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer, which take you through various prayers, psalms, and scripture readings. Because the Daily Office uses a lectionary (assigned set of scripture readings, changing on a weekly, or in this case, daily basis), it is probably easiest to use an app or online resource to guide you through Morning or Evening Prayer. Since I like to use an actual prayer book when possible, I keep a book in one hand and my phone in the other, tuned into the Mission St. Clare online resource. If you don't have time for the full Morning or Evening Prayer experience, not to worry. The Prayer Book also has a section called "Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families" with a short (one page) set of prayer that you can use in the morning, at noon, in the early evening, or at night. I encourage you to take some time this Lent to familiarize yourself with The Book of Common Prayer. It is foundational to the theology and worship of the Episcopal Church, and it is a rich resource for spiritual practice.


