Hello Trinity family,

I am humbled and excited to have been called to serve as Curate, and the opportunity to walk alongside each of you and see what God has in store for our future journey together. My wife, Jessica and I, had the honor of meeting and speaking with many of you and witness the many ways that the Holy Spirit is working in God's world through each of you and Trinity's robust and varied ministries in March, and we wanted to extend our sincere appreciation for your welcome and hospitality. I am looking forward to working with Father Chase Danford, all members of the Ministry Team, the Esteemed Vestry, all Lay Leaders, and each of you who make Trinity such a special place to be and learning more about our awesome God through the lens of each of you. I am privileged to be serving my curacy at a parish with such wonderful and numerous ministries such as your work with the food insecure, various outreach programs, youth ministries, LGBTQIA+ affirming groups, and all of the other wonderful work that God and you accomplish together. Trinity is a place where the Gospel and our Baptismal Covenant are lived in God's world every day.

I wanted to introduce myself and tell you a little bit about my journey. I currently reside in Franklin Park, NJ with my wife Jessica, our dog Cody and cat Dylan. We both grew up in Southern NJ and the Roman Catholic faith tradition. My work took me away from home and made going to church difficult, but after moving back home in 2009, God guided me to the Episcopal church, and due to the incredible experience of God's welcoming love in this beautiful faith tradition, Jess and I became full members in the Episcopal church at St. Mary's Haddon Heights, NJ in 2015. We have both worn many hats including warden, vestry and mission committee and various worship positions.

I have been in the discernment process since 2019 and formed and graduated through the New Jersey School for Ministry in 2023, receiving all 7 Canonical licenses. During this process I have had the privilege of experiencing the challenge of rigorous academic and formational requirements, completed 600 hours of clinical pastoral education (CPE), sat and passed the General Ordination Exam (GOE) in 2025, and God willing and the Bishop and People consent, I will be ordained to the transitional Diaconate on June 20, 2026 at 2pm at Trinity Cathedral in Trenton, NJ. I would love to see you there! My sponsoring parish is Saint Mary's in Haddon Heights NJ, and I have completed internships at St. David's in Cranbury and St. John's Somerville.

In my secular life, I bring a different lens of broad experiences. I have spent 26 years in Federal Law Enforcement and retired as a Supervisory Agent from Homeland Security (Not ICE) in January 2026 from the New York Field Office. In my work, I have been assigned to multiple field offices: (Chicago, Detroit, Philadelphia, and New York) and have worked and traveled across the country and the globe. I received my Master's in Homeland Security from St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia in 2012. I have been teaching as an Adjunct Professor of Criminal Justice at Camden County College NJ, since 2018, while working full time and continuing through the discernment and ordination process.

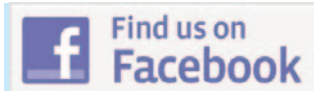
